

Who is David Attenborough?

Sir David Attenborough is one of the world's best-known natural history presenters. He was born in London in 1926 and grew up in Leicester. As a boy, he was fascinated by wildlife. He spent his time exploring parks and collecting fossils and insects.

After studying science at university, David joined the BBC. At first, he worked behind the scenes, but soon he began presenting programmes. His early series, *Zoo Quest*, took him around the world to film animals in their natural habitats.

Over many years, David created famous documentaries such as *Life on Earth* and *The Blue Planet*. These shows used new technology to capture never-before-seen animal behaviour. Viewers could watch whales swimming, birds dancing, and insects building homes.

David's storytelling makes science exciting and easy to understand. He explains complex ideas in simple ways, helping children and adults learn about ecosystems and food chains.

In recent years, Attenborough has spoken strongly about climate change and habitat loss. He warns that pollution, deforestation, and warming oceans threaten wildlife. He encourages people to recycle, save energy, and protect natural spaces.

David Attenborough has received many awards and even has species named after him. His life's work has inspired millions to love and protect the natural world.



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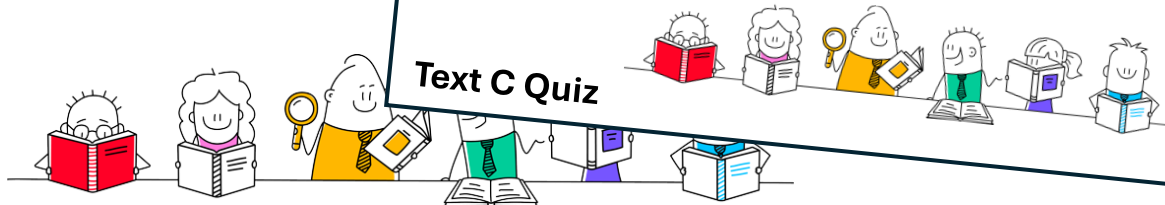
